Networks of Experts and Non-Traditional Security in Asia

From the 'migrant crisis' to transboundary haze pollution and the Avian Influenza virus, Asian countries continue to face multiple new security threats which require international cooperation. These non-traditional security (NTS) threats have affected the security of individuals, ethnic groups, women, and local communities. As a result of these multiple impacts, governments, businesses and non-governmental organisations increasingly turn to technical experts who can assess these issues, determine their effects on the general public, and suggest ways to address them.

Epistemic communities: Communities of experts shaping state and global affairs

The ways experts view and analyse a particular problem are highly influenced by their individual world views, cultural backgrounds, training and personal experiences. Experts may also support one another by forming **epistemic communities**, which are networks of knowledge-based experts to discuss policy ideas to address these challenges.

Apart from enriching the information base for decisions, epistemic communities may also contribute to changing the way a problem is seen, and the way governments perceive and act on them. For example, at the global level, underdevelopment has been reformed from a purely economic view. Through close collaboration among economists Muhbub ul Haq, Paul Streeten and Amartya Sen, this is now seen as human security. Paul Streeten argued to put people at centre-stage; Amartya Sen provided empirical evidence on how human capabilities contribute to economic growth; and Muhbub ul Haq developed the Human Development Index (HDI) which measured, tracked and published key aspects of human development such as literacy and life expectancy at the country-level. The HDIs have since been adopted by states, in the form of the UN Sustainable Development Goals, and non-state actors such as non-governmental organizations are now providing support towards achieving these goals.

Epistemic communities and Non-Traditional Security in Asia

In the same way that ul Haq, Sen and Streeten brought a new way of seeing underdevelopment, epistemic communities in Asia are breaking barriers and developing new perspectives for addressing NTS threats. The ASEAN Institutes for Strategic and International Studies (AISIS), a think-tank network, for instance, has provided venues for discussions that contributed to the institutionalisation of ASEAN as a regional governing

body, and the Council for Security Cooperation in the Asia Pacific (CSCAP) has pushed for the institutionalization of regional security structures.

Moving forward, more work needs to be done. Epistemic communities are pushing for getting human security assessments to focus on disparities across subgroups such as indigenous peoples and communities, as well as in the representation of women in politics, food, and even disasters. They are likewise helping to strengthen regional cooperation structures, such as through the development of a comprehensive, whole-of-ASEAN approach that addresses health hazards at the point of entry; frameworks for facing new migration challenges and identifying the risks and responsibilities of states; and directions for strengthening military capabilities for humanitarian assistance and disaster relief.

Relaunch of NTS Asia Consortium

Epistemic communities will continue to have an important role to play in finding solutions to NTS issues, both globally and within Asia. This month, we relaunch the NTS Asia Consortium, with the goal of strengthening and expanding this network. The Consortium will bring together regional NTS experts for knowledge exchange, to collaborate on research, and to capacity-build future experts so as to better update and direct regional and thereafter global NTS agendas.
